Students will be introduced to tools they can utilize at home to continue to build a foundation for success in 21st century careers with more challenging skills and coding languages on their own.

CSI: Crime Scene Investigators! (Offered Week of June 11 – 14 and July 9 – 12)

Using science-based inquiry to investigate crimes and find physical evidence, students will be part of the detective team, using the same or similar tools that forensics scientists use to find and lift fingerprints, examine physical evidence, and chemical test samples.
